"Movers & Shakers" Snapshot of Clintonville

Say, business owners, do you want to know who your Clintonville market is? Through the Clintonville Chamber's efforts, we now have the first market study of Clintonville in over 20 years. The market study was prepared by the nationally known firm, Boulevard Strategies, as a part of the overall report prepared by the firm, Main Street Connections. The Clintonville Chamber initiated the study, which was funded and implemented last summer by the city of Columbus.

Here are some of the market study findings: Over 48% of Clintonville households are "Movers and Shakers." These are defined as "singles and couples with no children, 2/3 own house, 1/3 rent; high levels of education and income, white collar occupations, primarily 35 to 49 years old; dine at upscale and full-service restaurants, own personal computers, invest in the stock market." By far, this is the largest lifestyle segment found in Clintonville.

Other statistics reported in the study include: Clintonville residents are highly educated. About half (50%) of persons aged 25 and over have at least a bachelor's degree. This compares to 27% in Franklin County. A very large percentage of Clintonville residents hold professional and technical positions (36%), followed by executive, administrative, and managerial occupations (18%).

Compared to Franklin County benchmarks, Clintonville has a much lower percentage of children, teenagers, and college-age adults (i.e. ages 5 to 24, 29% versus 36%) and a much larger percentage of seniors aged 65 and over (16% versus 11%). Clintonville residents spent \$300 million on retail purchases in 1998. Clintonville has a current estimate population of 24,636 persons in 11,498 households.
